

The 5 Life Saving Rules

Rules to ensure that everyone gets home alive, every day

1. WORKING AT HEIGHT:
WEARING A HARNESS



2. CONFINED SPACES:




1. WORKING AT HEIGHT: WEARING A HARNESS

In practice:

I protect myself from falls:

- If there is no collective protection in place, I wear a harness attached to a secure anchor point;
- I systematically check the condition of my harness before each use.

⇒ If these conditions are not met, I stop the work;

2. CONFINED SPACE: COMPLYING WITH ACCESS REQUIREMENTS

In practice:

I only enter a confined space if:

- I have a specific entry permit;
- All the safety conditions listed on the permit are met (proper atmosphere measurements, attendant present, etc.).

3. COORDINATED LOCK OUT: UNDERSTAND, CHECK, CONTROL RISKS

Before any intervention, I^(*) **consult** with the owner of the installation (producer) who issues the work authorization (whether the lockout was performed by production or by myself) to:

1. **Understand** the lockout performed and its scope
2. **Ensure** that the effective isolation of all energy sources and the absence of fluids have been **verified**
3. **Identify any residual risks together** (related to the installation or equipment if point 2 is not 100% possible) **and take the necessary measures:**
 - Adapted working method
 - Specific PPE
 - Additional preventive measures

After validating these three points:

- I **attach my padlock** to the lock box or to the element enabling isolation.
- The owner of the installation **issues the work permit**.

4. NEVER STAND UNDER A SUSPENDED LOAD

In practice:

I never position myself under a suspended load or in the exclusion zone (marked/baricaded):

- I remain at a safe distance until the load has been placed on the ground or securely stabilized.
- I respect the signage and never cross a marked/baricaded area (unless authorized by the lookout).



5. WEARING SEATBELTS IN ALL VEHICLES

In practice:

- I always wear my seatbelt when driving a vehicle or machine (car, truck, forklift*, bulldozer, tractor, etc.).
- The requirement to wear a seatbelt also applies to passengers.

** for forklifts, wearing a seatbelt is not mandatory if the cab is equipped with another restraint system (safety door), except on external roads where the highway code applies.*

Safety is not negotiable.

Everyone — Prayon employee, temporary worker, visitor — must always follow the Life Saving Rules.

Breaking a Life Saving Rule puts your life at risk.

Breaking a Life-Saving Rule means accepting the consequences, because your safety — and the safety of others — is our top priority.

You have the power and the duty to stop work if something seems unsafe.

Prayon Management

I am responsible for my own safety and I pay attention to the safety of others!

I always assess the risks I am exposed to.

If necessary, I stop to ensure safe working conditions.
